How to Use This Template

Instructions for completing the FRE 902(13) / 902(14) certification

WHO QUALIFIES AS A "QUALIFIED PERSON"

Under FRE 902(13), a "qualified person" is someone with sufficient knowledge of the electronic process to describe how it works and attest that it produces accurate results. This does not require a forensic expert. In practice, this is typically the attorney or paralegal who manages the evidence in the platform, or a representative of the platform provider who can describe the technical process.

WHEN TO PREPARE THE CERTIFICATION

Prepare the certification well in advance of trial or any evidentiary hearing. The certification must be provided to all parties before the evidence is offered. Attempting to authenticate digital evidence for the first time at trial risks exclusion. See FRCP 26(a) and the applicable court's scheduling order for production deadlines.

NOTICE REQUIREMENTS TO OPPOSING COUNSEL

FRE 902(13) requires that the certification be provided within the time required by Rule 902(11), which in turn requires "reasonable written notice" before trial. Some courts have held this means 14 days; others apply longer periods. Provide the certification as early as practicable and confirm the notice period with the court's local rules.

HOW TO COMPUTE SHA-256 HASHES

macOS / Linux (Terminal):

```
shasum -a 256 filename.mp4
```

Windows (Command Prompt):

```
certutil -hashfile filename.mp4 SHA256
```

Windows (PowerShell):

```
Get-FileHash filename.mp4 -Algorithm SHA256
```

Record the hash value exactly as displayed. The hash is case-insensitive but must match character-for-character. Any modification to the file will produce a completely different hash.
